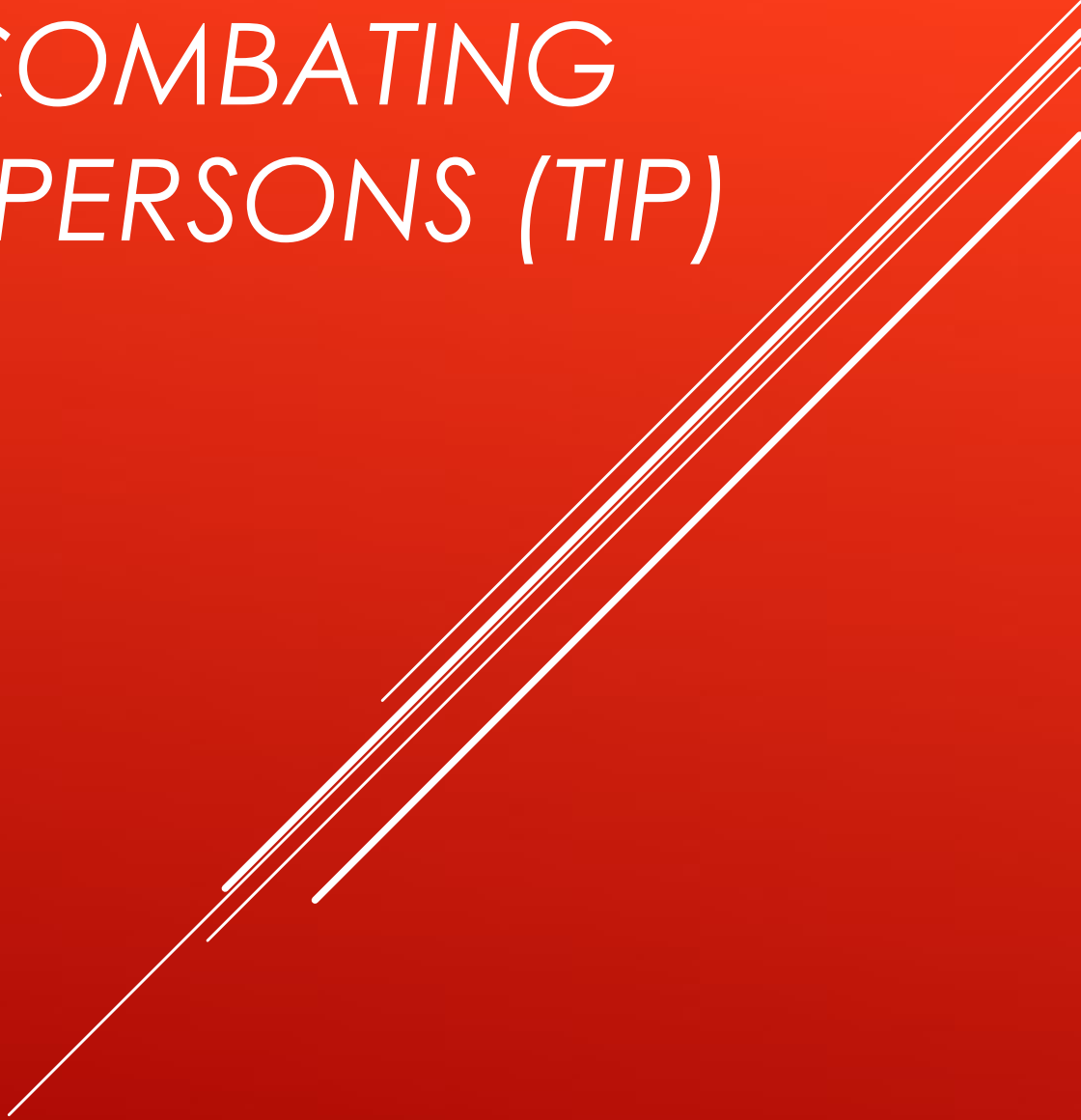

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THE ROLE OF WOMEN'S LEADERSHIP

Essential:

- *Enables a more comprehensive and careful approach*
 - *Helps build victims' trust*
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GAPS AND CHALLENGES

- ▶ *Indonesia's vast geographical area*
 - ▶ *TIP is spread across all regions of Indonesia*
 - ▶ *Lack of gender sensitivity among law enforcement officers*
 - ▶ *Limited number of female judges (around 25% of approximately 8,000 judges in Indonesia)*
 - ▶ *Limited number of women in judicial leadership positions (around 29%)*
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- *Strengthening women's leadership and participation in combating TIP*
- *Providing opportunities for women to lead courts (as Chief Judges and Vice Chiefs)*
- *Conducting awareness-raising and training on TIP for judges*
- *Implementing:*
 - *Supreme Court Regulation No. 3 of 2017 on Guidelines for Adjudicating Cases Involving Women in Conflict with the Law*
 - *Handbook on Adjudicating Cases Involving Women in Conflict with the Law*
 - *Supreme Court Regulation No. 1 of 2002 on Procedures for Filing Claims for Restitution and Compensation for Crime Victims*
